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The authors regret that the following statement from the original article: “Therefore, we recommend classifying small pulmonary nodules as *indeterminate* if there are fewer than four with a diameter less than 5 mm or if there is one nodule measuring greater than 5 mm and less than

10 mm” should say “Therefore, we recommend classifying small pulmonary nodules as *indeterminate* if there are ≤ 4 with a diameter < 5 mm or if there is one nodule measuring ≥ 5 mm and < 10 mm”.
